BRICK WALLS PARTLY UP AT NEW FORD PLANT

Brick work is progressing at the new Ford plant under construction here, and by next week the section completed will be ready for the coping, according to Karl Sanford, Albrecht construction superintendent. Workmen have built the walls along the northerly or front portion of the structure, about two-thirds back on either side, and so far nothing has been done on walls of the rear portion, awaiting final plans from the Motor Company.

Since Monday workmen have been digging a ditch from the lower mill pond across the former George Ott property, where electrical power conduit from the proposed power house on the pond to the plant will be laid. For passage across the pond a regular submarine cable will be used, it is said. A connection will also be made with the Edison power line, where the conduit crosses Commerce street, for further guarantee of non-shortage of power.

Trucks are still hauling dirt from the plant site, where a bank along the west side of the Ford property had been practically removed. Though dirt was moved to make the fill at the lower pond, and some dirt is now being drawn to widen the little piece of road south of the Benson bridge.
