LOTS OF ACTIVITY NOW AT NEW FORD PLANT

SEVEN MILFORD LADS ARE NOW CITIZENS OF WOLVERINE STATE

GO TO EAST LANSING THURSDAY TO PARTICIPATE IN GOVERNMENT RUNNING

PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE IS GOAL

The Wolverine Boys' State, under the direction of the American Legion, Department of Michigan, began to function Thursday, June 16th, at the Michigan State College at East Lansing.

Seven boys from this community and nearby localities are enrolled under the auspices of the Milford Post No. 216, of the Legion. The boys reporting were: Victor Bovee, Dale Harter, Dick Arma, Charles Tressler, all of Milford; Charles F. Weiss, New Hudson; Norman H. Smith, Walled Lake, and William Helm, Highland.

The Wolverine Boys' State will be conducted for a period of ten days, from June 16th to 25th, and is an effort of the American Legion to bring to boys of the state of Michigan a knowledge of the fundamental principles of the American government through the actual practice and control of city, county and state offices.

As future voters and office holders the youth of Michigan should have an understanding of the problem of elective officials, their duties, and functions.

Every boy attending will have a definite part in the functions of Boys' State and the total enrollment is approximately 800 from every section of Michigan.

BRICK LAYERS, PLUMBERS, ELECTRICIANS, CARPENTERS, AND OTHERS BUSY ON THE JOB

Moving along with somewhat of an accelerated pace this week the new Ford plant construction is making progress. Electricians, plumbers, brick masons and carpenters are working steadily, plumbers moving onto the job Monday. Started this week also, is the job of laying a sewer line from the plant to connect with the municipal sewer system, the connection to be made at Detroit street. The ditch will be 16 feet deep in places, and a ditching machine has been brought here for trenching.

The Rogers steam shovel has finished grading, at least for the time being, and the trucks returned to Detroit Monday night, after more than three weeks on the job. The bank along the west side of the Ford property has been cut back, and graded down, and the area leveled off for use as a future parking lot, greatly changing the appearance of this section. Another crew is putting in electrical conduit, for power cables, running north from the lower pond across Ford land to the plant. Three large manholes with drainage pits are part of this equipment. A submarine cable will be laid across the lower pond, it is said, connecting with the power plant to be built on the south shore.
