HENRY FORD PAYS BRIEF VISIT TO HIS NEW PLANT HERE

ARRIVES THIS THURSDAY A. M.
WITH PARTY TO VIEW PRO-
GRESS OF DEVELOPMENT

WORK AT PLANT SLACKENED

Henry Ford made a brief visit to
Milford this Thursday morning for
an inspection of the Ford Motor Com-
pany's development here. The motor
magnate arrived about 10 o'clock, his
accompanying party occupying two
automobiles. It is reported that they
drove to the factory site, but Mr.
Ford did not leave the car. The auto-
mobiles were driven slowly around
the new building, and then the party
whisked away.

Work on the main structure of the
Ford plant here has been more or
less at a standstill the past few days,
awaiting instructions regarding some
changes still to be made in the en-
gine room. A section of the main
floor has not yet been poured, held
up for final designs. It is said
that provision is being made for an
additional engine for auxiliary
power.

Bricklayers have been off for over
a week. Walls in the forepart are all
up, coping on, and the metal roof.
Walls around the power plant at the
rear have not been completed.

A number of operations are being
carried on, however, to bring the big
job nearer its completion.

A sewer line has been started to
connect with the village sanitary
sewer system. The line will be car-
ried across the upper pond on piling,
crossing the water just below the
inlet through the rail right-of-way.
The connection will be opposite,
along Highland road, and an excava-
tion has been made for a small
pump house at this point. An excava-
ting machine has been working
this week on the sewer.

FIFTY-THREE WPA WORKERS
ASSIGNED HERE; SET UP
FOR 5 MONTHS

Milford's \$25,000 WPA job for main-
tenance and construction of side
walks began this Thursday morning
when a large number of WPA work-
ers from this and nearby sections
reported for work. In all some 56
workers have been assigned to the
Milford job. Most of the men have
been on other projects and were
transferred here.

Work was begun on Detroit street
at the corner of Main street, along
the former S. L. Rowe property now
owned by Leroy Darling. By after-
noon sections on Detroit street be-
tween Union and Hickory had been
taken out, preparatory to rebuilding.

It will be several days before the
job is really underway and running
smoothly, according to Floyd Sands,
foreman of construction. Lack of
trucks and working tools kept many
of the men in idleness this Thursday.
Many of the men coming from these
jobs had not received transfer slips,
and were therefore not eligible to be
put on the job, Thursday.

The project is set for five months,
and the federal government provides
funds for all labor, totaling \$20,951.
The village supplies material at an
estimated cost of \$3,850. Village of-
ficials state that they have no juris-
diction over who is hired by WPA.
According to regulations, WPA labor
is taken from relief rolls, and all ap-
plicants for work on the job at Mil-
ford should apply at the relief office
in Pontiac.

conduit from the lower pond to the
factory site have about reached the
plant. The conduit is four inch as-
bestos pipe, laid in the trench three
wide and three high and securely
held, being entirely covered with
concrete. Large manholes at inter-
vals permit working space for
trouble shooting. A connection with
the Edison service is provided for at
Commerce street. The power lines
will be later worked through the
conduit.
