ing with a policy inaugurated by Henry Ford several years ago, to de- centralize his industry. He has now some twenty small plants all in op- eration at various locations near De- troit. The plant at Milford will be for the manufacture of carburetors, and will be equipped to build and assemble the entire unit from casting to com- pletion.

Bricklayers are busy laying up walls around the engine and boiler rooms at the new Ford plant here, and will be on the job about two weeks more, it is stated. Ford men are installing the heavy boilers, shipped here about two weeks ago, and plumbers are working in the building, and a general scene of activity prevails as work progresses daily. However, much re- mains to be done before the building is completed.
