COMMUNITY COUNCIL SPONSORING MOVE; TOYS MAY BE LEFT AT TIMES OFFICE

SECTION IN LOWER POND ABOUT COMPLETED; LANDSCAPING AT FORD PLANT HOLDS BEAUTY PROMISE

Toys, Toys, who has toys? Toys which still have usefulness but whose owner has no future use for them. Such toys may yet be made to serve new purpose and bring joy in the heart of some youngster, when freshly painted and restored.

The Community Service Council is sponsoring a collection of toys and has named ~~the~~ as a receiving depot. Toys received will be turned over to manual arts classes for restoration and repair. Already the first consignment has been received and others are expected to follow. It is planned to have these toys in readiness for Christmas, which incidentally is but seven short weeks away. Your co-operation in this matter is solicited.

The Community Service Council met Tuesday evening at the Municipal building with nine representatives present. In addition to the toy project outlined above, the council will sponsor collection of clothing. Serviceable garments are wanted which may be turned over to some worthy individual or family. Clothing may be left at the Municipal building. Seasonable garments are wanted, particularly, winter wear.

50,000 SQUARE FEET NEW SIDEWALK LAID

Fifty thousand square feet of new sidewalk has been laid in Milford since the beginning of the WPA sidewalk project in Milford last summer, reports Floyd Sands, general foreman on the job. This includes all replacements as well as several stretches of new construction. The set-up calls for the building of 73,500 square feet, and work not completed this fall will be carried over until next spring.

How long the project will continue this month will depend somewhat on weather conditions, although Mr

Covering of the first laid sections of the 48" pipe which will carry water from Moore's Lake to a power plant on the lower mill pond has been started this week. These sections are midway across the pond, south to the end of the tube and site of the proposed power station. Pipe has been laid entirely across the lower pond and Commerce street to a point where tunneling under the P. M. right-of-way will start. This latter operation is awaiting final approval by railroad engineers.

Pipelaying activities are to be transferred to the upper pond the latter part of this week, where excavating has been completed and piling and supports prepared to receive the 40 foot steel sections.

West Commerce street, closed to traffic for ten days or so, will soon be reopened, the roadway now being filled in and made ready for use.

Sections of the pipeline already laid will be waterproofed around welded joints. This work is done from inside the pipe. A large fan is being installed at the pipe entrance, which will blow into the line, keeping the air agitated while workmen are inside the line.

Extensive work around the new factory site has begun, and gives Milfordites something of a preview as to what to expect when the project is finally completed. Pond banks directly in front of the new plant are now receiving attention, and it is said that all this area will be eventually landscaped. Great improvement has been already noted, and what this area will look like five years hence, can hardly be imagined. Plans contemplate refilling of all bodies of water, as soon as work has been completed. The Kahn architectural firm is said to be now designing a new spillway for the upper mill pond.

When work on building of the power plants will be started has not been announced, although it is anticipated that something along that line will be done in the near future. Rumor has it that Ford Motor will build the smaller plant on the lower pond themselves, and the larger on the Huron river will be let by contract.
