Dr. Thomas A Wood says *“People develop a sense of place”* through experience and knowledge of a particular area. A sense of place emerges through knowledge of the **history, geography and geology** of an area, its **flora and fauna**, the **legends** of a place, and a growing sense of the land and its **history** after living there for a time.”



In the Milford Historical Society, our mission is to educate others about the history of Milford...the movie studios that became Kensington Park; the Powerhouse that stands as a monument to Henry Ford's industrial villages project; the Annual Home Tour with insights into how our ancestors developed our community; Victorian Teas at the Mary Jackson house to experience old customs and see historic fashions; our museum with the simulated Victorian homestead and exhibits on the main floor, which include a facsimile of an early log home in which the first teacher in Milford lived with her six children and husband while teaching the neighborhood children.

There is such a rich heritage in Milford – it is what makes this a place where we want to live, shop, and enjoy our lives. There is also more of Milford's history that can be presented. There is the abandoned train station that could be restored. There is the adjacent site of the first automotive plant – making parts for Chevrolet in the 1800's. It became a jelly factory – what a great place for GM and Ford memorabilia. Did you know that the Proving Grounds were developed to test safety measures on cars – and were the first of their kind? Do you know where “Little Egypt” was located in Milford Village? Do you know the old swimming hole which children called “Pike Town” in the early 1900's?

The history of the doorknob factory, furniture makers, whiskey distillers, as well as famous inhabitants – international opera singers, movie stars (2), entrepreneurs who founded international companies, etc.... these are items which need to be documented, exhibited, and preserved for our community.
