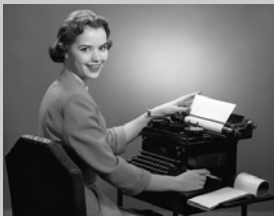

The 2010 Home Tour will feature five beautiful area homes and visits to the Log Cabin, Powerhouse and MSH Museum. This year we are planning a special treat at the Mary Jackson home. Mary would have turned 100 this year so we are planning birthday surprises.

Be sure and check out the September Newsletter for specific information on the five homes and watch for the "See Me in September" signs during Milford Memories for a sneak preview. Need a sneak peek? Drive or walk down E. Liberty and check out the homes at 214 and 410.

Walk by the Pettibone Creek Hydroelectric Station in Milford and you'll find a new beautifully-designed interpretive sign which was produced by the MotorCities National Heritage Area.

MotorCities is an affiliate of the National Park Service and this organization is dedicated to preserving, interpreting and promoting the automotive and labor heritage of Michigan.
