From Your President, Norm Werner

As we bring another year to an end we need to briefly look back and then look ahead to 2011. 2010 was a tough year for many in the Milford community. The tough economic conditions were also reflected in our lower average for membership dues. We did have a very good Granny's Attic Sale and our Home Tour was a big success. Those are two of our main fund raisers during the year. It was also a very costly year, with the museum painting consuming much of our annual budget at \$7,500. We received a good quality job for that money and it was the lowest bid that we received; still, it was a major drain on our already tight budget.



Next year we face the need to take care of other maintenance items that have been delayed as long as they can be. The museum is a very old building with many major systems or components at or near the end of their expected lives. At our current membership level and with our current funds we are able to take on only one major maintenance project a year.

We were extremely fortunate this year to be the beneficiaries of a community give-back effort by Phil Rashid of Rashid Construction. Phil contributed the materials and labor to replace some major areas of wood rot on the museum, work that we were going to have to delay for another year, due to funding constraints. Our sincere thanks go out to Phil Rashid.

There are a number of things that need attention at the museum and at the Mary Jackson house, which the MHS also owns and is trying to maintain. If any members have the desire to either contribute time or money to some of the needed repairs, replacement or maintenance items that need attention, please let us know. It could be anything from a new roof to a new furnace to many other items that you could help with.

And speaking of helping, I want to thank all of the members who volunteered at such events as the 4th of July parade, Granny's Attic sale, the Tea's at Mary Jackson's House and the Home Tour. Organizations like the MHS are a lot like church organizations - nothing gets done without volunteers helping out. The Board of Directors tend to take on the responsibility for those events, but they can't do it without the help of many members and we appreciate that help.

Looking forward to 2011, we have a pressing need to get new members of the community involved with MHS. We need more volunteers. We need more financial support of the MHS and its programs. If you know of anyone who might be interested in joining, please invite them to a meeting and give them an application (available at the museum or the website—www.milfordhistory.org).

We will continue our theme – “*You don't have to be a relic to join*” – in 2011 and hope that we can get 20-30 new member families in 2011. In fact, I challenge you all to make history while we are all trying to preserve the history of Milford – let's challenge ourselves to double the size of the MHS in 2011. If everybody gets one new member to join we can make that happen. Sue Bullard is lining up some great membership meeting programs for 2011, which we will share on the website and in the next newsletter. So, grab a friend, a relative or a neighbor and get them out to a meeting this coming year and let's get them started preserving Milford's history, too.

2010 Home Tour Report

The annual Home Tour provides the funding for the operation and upkeep of the Milford Historical Museum and other projects sponsored by the Historical Society including student docent scholarships, microfilming of the Milford Times, the Mary Jackson house and the Fourth of July parade. This is why we greatly appreciate everyone who volunteers their time and expertise to the Home Tour.

This year's Home Tour was successful. We sold approximately 550 tickets and offered complimentary tickets to 170 docent and sponsors. The net profit from ticket sales totaled \$7,845.00. Our Home Tour Sponsorship Program grossed \$2,150.00. After expenses the 2010 Home Tour raised \$9,294.23. This will certainly go a long way in helping us maintain and operate the museum and supporting the Society's many projects.
