We had quite a few people stop by and inquire about the Historical Society and we sold a few books and other items, in addition to the water that we were selling in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce. It was quite an effort to undertake – manning the booth all three days, all day long, but we pulled it off and made a little money, too.

By the time this newsletter gets out we should have chosen a roofer for the museum and the project might be underway or even done. We are also adding insulation while the roof is done, so that we make the new shingles last longer and hopefully make it a little less expensive to heat and cool the museum. This is our major museum maintenance/improvement project for the year. Thanks go out to a donor who wants to remain anonymous for a generous donation that should cover about half of the cost of the job.

Our last two programs of the year in September and November wrap up the Program Committee job for Sue Bullard, who is a Vice-President of the Society and has been the Program Committee Chairperson for the last few years. Sue's final two programs are a presentation by Sam Offen, a Holocaust survivor, and a program by Keith Wunderlich on the history of Michigan's own Vernor's ginger ale.

Sue has so many things on her plate with the other things that she does for the Society events and managing the Mary Jackson House that she needed to off-load the program duties. This enables you to walk all or part of the home tour. If you want to take an early peek, look for the homes at 540 Union, 629 North Main, 645 North Main, 722 North Main and 859 Laurel Lane in Milford Bluffs. We are also pleased to announce a guide by cell phone tour which features the lives and homes of eight Milford Civil War veterans. We thank the Oak Grove Cemetery Fund for providing the guide by cell tour. A

tour map and the cell phone number will be available at the museum. The 2011 Home Tour will also include visits to the Log Cabin, Powerhouse, and MHS Museum. On Sunday, step back in history and visit the Tractor Show in the Huron Valley Bank parking lot at 130 South Milford Rd and the Car Show on Main St.

The tour runs from 11:00 AM – 5:00 PM both days. Tickets are \$15/ adults and \$13/ seniors and will be available before September 17th at Main Street Art (432 N. Main), Acorn Farm (367 N. Main), Your Nesting Place (322 N. Main) and the Milford Historical Museum (124 E. Commerce, open Wednesdays and Saturdays 1 PM – 4 PM).

Sam Offen, Holocaust Survivor

There are those that claim the Holocaust never happened. Sam Offen can tell us the truth firsthand—he lived it, survived it, and now dedicates much of his life to educating others about it. We are honored to have Sam Offen, a Holocaust survivor, as the guest speaker at our general membership meeting on **Thursday evening, September 8th.**

Sam was born in Krakow, Poland, in 1921. His life would change completely once the Nazi army entered Krakow on September 6th, 1939. During the Nazi regime, he suffered ghetto confinement, slave labor and the horrors of the Mauthausen Concentration Camp. More than 50 members of his immediate and extended family were killed. Sam will share his personal story of triumph—from his experiences as a starving prisoner in a concentration camp, to that jubilant day of May 5th, 1945 as he witnesses American tanks arriving to liberate the camp.

Upon hearing his amazing life story, many encouraged Sam to write his autobiography. Although reluctant for many years, he eventually agreed. His book, "*When Hope Prevails, the Personal Triumph of a Holocaust Survivor*," will be available for purchase at the meeting. A portion of the proceeds will benefit the Holocaust Memorial Center in Farmington Hills.

The meeting will begin with a potluck dinner at 6:30 PM at the Milford Methodist Church located at 1200 Atlantic St. A brief business meeting will begin at 7:30 PM followed immediately by the program. Please feel free to invite a guest—all are welcome. You do not have to be a historical society member to enjoy a Thursday evening with people interested in history. We ask that you bring your own table service and a dish to pass based on the first letter of your last name as shown below.

Museum News from Marlene Gomez



The Milford Historical Society has received a wonderful donation from Bob Pearson of Merritt Island, FL. Bob has given us two beautifully-framed coins which contain metal that was carried to the moon by the crews of Apollo 8 and Apollo

11. Bob’s ancestors came to Milford back in 1835 from England—you might recognize “Pearson Road” south of the GM Proving Ground. Bob actually grew up in Holly, MI. He joined the Air Force in 1952 and was an instrument trainer until 1960 when he became a civilian instructor with flight simulators. Bob has lived in Roswell, NM, Oklahoma City, OK, W. Palm Beach and Gainesville, FL and has trained astronauts on the Gemini and Apollo space programs. He personally knows many astronauts including Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin. After retiring from the Kennedy Space Center in 1974, he continued to work for the W. Palm Beach County Energy Program until 2003. Bob enjoys visiting Milford and is a member of our historical society.
