“Haven Hill”

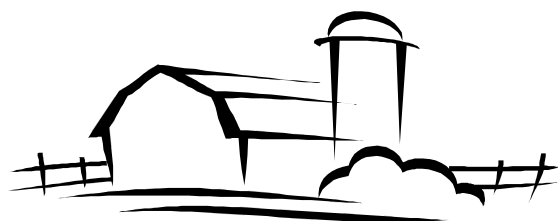
The Friends of Highland Recreation Area is a group of individuals and organizations that are determined to save the historic structures in the Highland Recreation Area. At our September General Membership Meeting we will meet **Chris Arble** and **Jay Fitzgerald** who will cover the past, present and future of the Highland Recreation Area.

In the mid-1920’s, auto magnate Edsel Ford began to purchase land in the Highland and White Lake areas. By 1931, he had successfully constructed a retreat for his family. It included a lodge, gatehouse, riding stable and sheep barn. Some of the famous visitors to the lodge included Thomas Edison and Charles Lindbergh. Unfortunately, Edsel Ford died suddenly in 1943 at the age of 49. Six years later, Eleanor sold the 2,422-acre retreat to the State of Michigan.

The years have not been kind to the property the Ford clan called Haven Hill. In 1949, the same year the state acquired the property, fire destroyed the riding stable. In 1999, the lodge that once housed the Ford family and their guests was destroyed by fire. And most recently, the sheep barn that our speakers were restoring was severely damaged by the high winds early last Spring. But our guests are undaunted. Working with the remaining part of the barn, they intend to continue their preservation efforts.

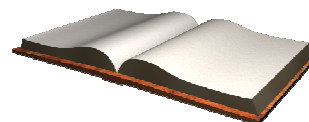

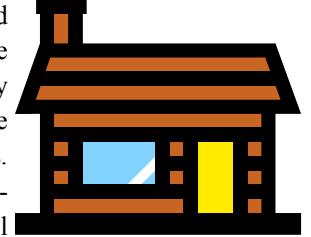

Visit during Home Tour 2008

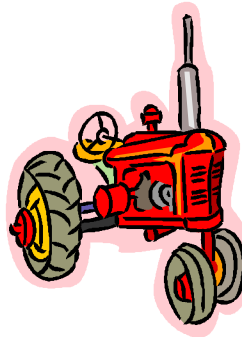
